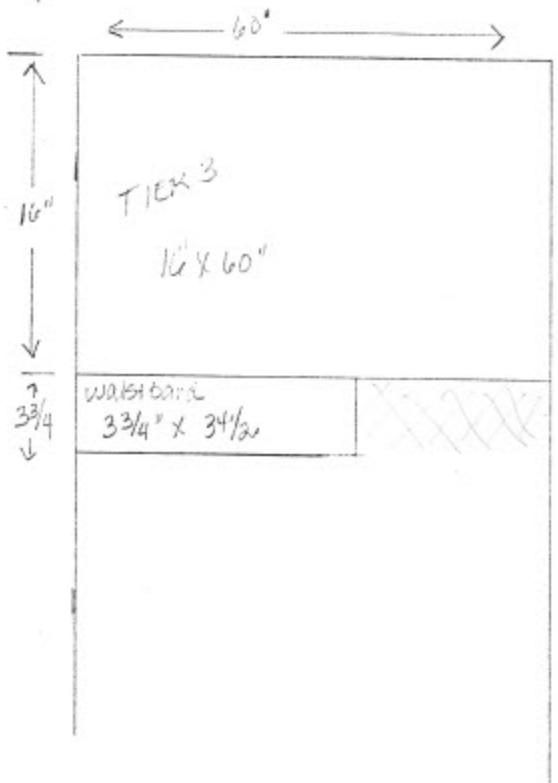
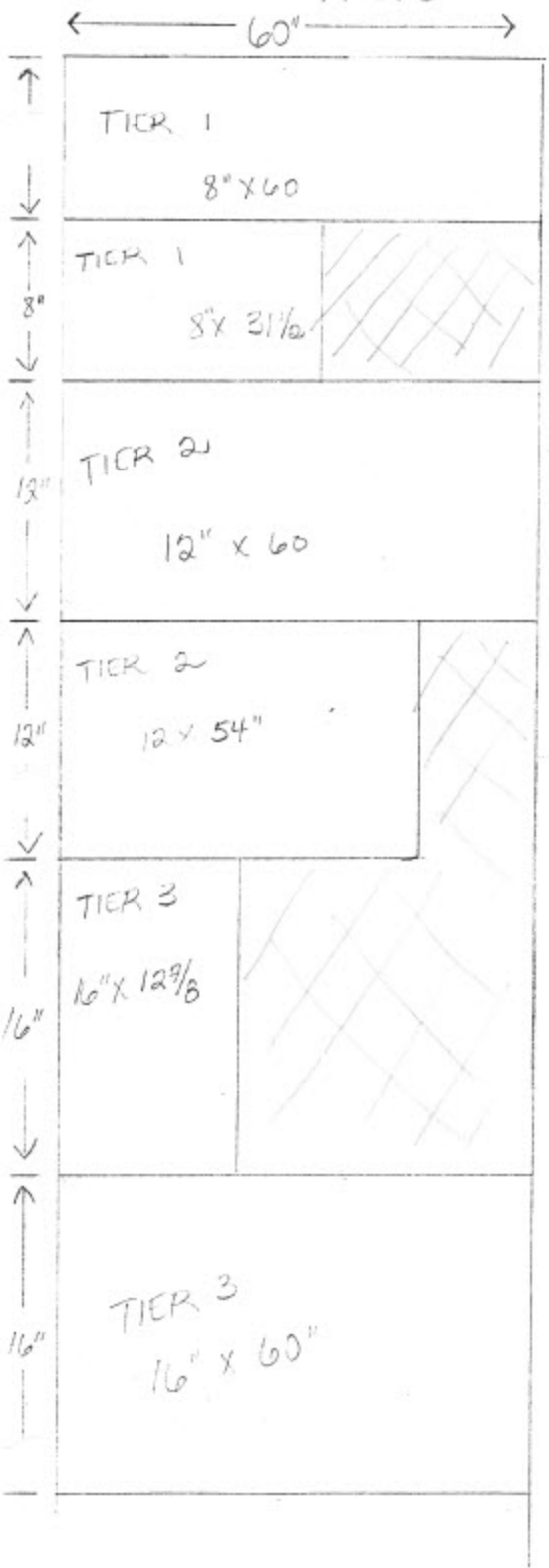


PROTO 1 size M



TOTAL YARDAGE 2 2/3 yds.

PLEATS:

Top edge of each tier has 1/4" pleat, 1/4" apart.

Bottom edge of 1st/2nd tier has 1/4" pleats, 1/2" apart.

"BROOKSIDE" SKIRT

3/8" seam allowance

3/4" hem allowance

Notes written after the fact.

initially developed by waist measurement using a fullness factor of .5 (all tiers).

Leona sewed sample, said production methods at this plant will not allow a waist casing. Therefore, wide elastic insert has to be serge'd in, then stitched down.

1st tier re-made to stretch length of 26" elastic.

also - sides of skirt hung a tad longer than CF/CB, reduced 1st tier sides to compensate.

Took a long time (comparatively) to make skirt - everybody else was trying to say was made with sew-in pleats, argued it wasn't - didn't believe me till they saw prot. as per their "idea". Got so fed up with "channels" I took the skirt home and treated pleats w/ corn starch. Brought it back to "ool's and oak's".

Currently, have been waiting for ~~the~~ one week to get grade scale from Tom - pattern is made to fit the goods. Style



needs a complete different pattern per size. Have recommended only 2 sizes S/M and L/XL.

Actual pattern differs from layout guides included.

Ruffling machine adjustment for tier 2 is #6. For tier 3 is #11.

9-23-92. ~~4~~ after working on samples and "the lowest common denominator" have decided I need to remake pattern.

Specifically place notch on waistband fold over and cut third tier into 4 sections. Can perhaps reduce 2nd tier ruffle depth to that of 3rd tier. 4 piece 3rd tier reduces need for notches.

9-29- did ~~not~~ 3rd tier can't be cut into 4 - due to marker considerations. But can be cut into 6ths. problem solved.

Also T. decided didn't like skirt - we made another one, both sides of each tier gathered. Everybody hated it.

11-23. Salesman wants skirt extended to 36". doing that now.
